


President David Mahon and the ALSGBI Council look forward to welcoming all delegates to this reception in the Industry Exhibition, Main Auditorium.



A brief history of the Naval Heritage Club of Portsmouth

Our Conference Dinner will take place at the Royal Maritime Club and Hotel, one of the oldest hotels in Portsmouth, originally opened in 1850 to look after sailors and mariners who were 'between ships'. The Sailor's Home aimed to provide respectable home comforts as well as a safe place to leave money!

It gained royal patronage in 1855, after Prince Albert visited the hotel. Queen Victoria then became the patron and there have been royal visits throughout the 20th century, including Queen Elizabeth II (patron until 2007) in 1986 and the now King Charles (patron since 2007) a year later.

The hotel did not make it through World War 2 unscathed. On 10 January 1941, half of the building was destroyed by bombs, only for the remainder to be razed two months later. However, it was not abandoned for long. The Royal Navy rebuilt it from the ground up, reopening on 14 March 1952. It has been a home from home for many members of the Armed Forces ever since.

The Club has over 8,000 members of whom 7,500 are serving or retired seafarers, soldiers or airmen. Police, fire and ambulance service members, volunteers from the RNLI and members of the Portsmouth local community make up the rest. The Club has a Bond of Friendship with HMS Prince of Wales in honour of Queen Elizabeth II, at the time of her first commissioning. Around the hotel you will notice a wealth of Royal Navy and marine memorabilia, including paintings, photos, prints and maritime artifacts, as well as the plaques bearing individual ship's crests or logos of service charities.
